THE NILE IS LONGER AND MORE ROMANTIC THAN THE AMAZON

A crocodile-witness, little kaki scouts, burning news, women soldiers. For her first solo exhibition at Galerie Dix9, South African artist Claudia Tennant delivers a series of striking paintings with dark and shimmering accents. As solar as they are enigmatic, as macabre as they are drolatic, these large formats transport us into an ambiguous and inner universe, haunted by a global history with complex ramifications, with terrible scenarios, at the heart of which is Africa.

A long history punctuated by kingdoms that are made and broken, expeditions, territorializations and trophies, in front of which her prowess consists in louvoyer in the matter memorialization, to meander among legends and deeds, to build up over time, a codex, another history book, a survival manual almost. Thus she gives body and life in Mino (Our Mothers) and Nawi, to the women warriors who constituted the elite unit of king Gezo and the empire of Dahomey in the nineteenth century. Elsewhere, she restores to the tsetse all the aura and monumentality that are due to it. She draws a twirling cable supposed to connect continents... The figures on the foot refer to the heroes of yesterday and the day before, some occulted, others overestimated, but all wear masks and look like puppets. Names and phrases resonate colloquially and their crossover teases the mind. In this theatre, we wonder who is talking and where.

Although Claudia Tennant's work is well documented, wellinformed and critical, it is striking by her sense of humour and vitality. She is wary of the images that are supposedly shared, and knows that wanting to paint Africa too well is a risky undertaking. To distance the procession of learned and impressionist sources from which she inherited, she in turn caviared it. She finds in what she calls "simplified form" an immediacy of gesture and a freedom of tone that reconnect with the spirit of bad painting and free expression. Here we are talking about unfinished work, even in the overflow of painting, of voices and buried images that must be raised to the surface and dare to be pictured.
