NO SAND IN THE SKY

For his first solo exhibition in France, Alexander Morozov, Russian artist of Ukrainian origin, presents at Galerie Dix9 a new project based mainly on his recent artistic production. The painter, who left Russia in 2022*, places at the centre of this exhibition a series of images «objects»: tempera on wood that represent fragments of a lived reality.

Temperas protected by several layers of varnish, enter into a subtle dialogue with the (interior) light they reflect. They face a series of watercolors assembled in a compact mass on a wall of the gallery, fixing on paper some lived moments, like a diary. Products of an artistic practice based on memory, this series reveals the photographic spectra stolen from the real by Morozov during his long journey of assumed exile.

In fact, Morozov seeks more to transmit a process than a result. The first step in this work consists in capturing, by digital photography, what he calls the "interstices of reality". For example, the look of a Turkish stray dog, happy to have been fed, or a view overlooking the interior of an Estonian boat. These optical prints are then transformed. They are captured in the instantaneity of watercolour, or by the meticulous technique of tempera on wood: «levkas».

The levkas is a white coating posed as the background of the icon. It reflects the pigments so as to obtain a surface particularly bright. The main component of this coating is calcium carbonate, an organic fossil. This gives the technique an «original» connotation. In this sense, levkasé is traditionally considered a metaphysical receptacle for icons. Morozov invests this support with figurations apparently innocuous. In reality, they put us in the presence of a lived experience.

Visual notebook to be shared, *No sand in the sky* therefore brings us at the border between reality and experience. Morozov would have overcome the condition of exile by paying attention to insignificant things. That is, he focuses on the «liminal spaces», which mark the transition from optical information to sensitive interpretation. To do this, the artist carefully collected his phenomenal impressions, along his sinuous trajectory between Estonia, Turkey and France.

Between the composite film and the single image, the conscious accumulation of sensations and the optical unconscious, the network of common meanings and the absence of subject, the insignificance of trauma and the desire to make sense: there are openings and possible reconciliations. These are considered during the aesthetic journey of the artist.

The title of the exhibition refers to the Prussian tale *The Sandman*, written at the beginning of the 19th century by E.T.A. Hoffmann. The hero of the tale must overcome the hallucinatory madness of the spectre that haunts him. *No sand in the sky* resumes the impossibility of going back. Alexander Morozov simply tries to materialize the pain of such an observation.
