TIGER IS A TIGER IS A TIGER IS A TIGER

For his first solo exhibition in France, Farhad Farzali chose a symbolic element to evocate his home country, Azerbaijan: the tiger. According to the words of the artist, his country is indeed his only muse, a charming mystery which has to be solved. His homeland located close to Persian, Ottoman and Russian Empires becomes an inspirational kaleidoscope of customs, traditions, and rituals.

Farhad Farzali accurately examined anthropological samples of his native cultural context, carefully cataloged all forms of the new art, and the archaic elements turning back and actualized to create neofolk artifacts.

The exhibition made especially for Galerie Dix9 in Paris is a dialogue between the artist and the two azeri curators, Azad Asifovich and Asli Samadova.

The title of the exhibition, *Tiger is a tiger is a tiger,* refers to Gertrude Stein's quote *Rose is a rose is a rose is a rose* in her 1922 poem *Sacred Emily* in *Geography and Plays.* This quotation invokes the polysemic force of the word «rose», which represents as much a first name as a flower or a color, while underlining the law of identity which stipulates that everything is what it is. The meaning shifts never escape an expressive unity and a set of common, even universal, models.

In Azerbaijan, the tiger is a symbol full of history and imagery. Exterminated in the country, this animal embodies the pagan past of Azerbaijan, and more precisely a divine Mesopotamian attribute, which represents prestige and victorious hunting. Over time, the tiger remains an essential decorative element, present in Persian mosaics from antiquity to the modern era, as hunted and prized prey. It is the harbinger of an angelic apparition in certain Islamic traditions.

In contemporary culture, the tiger has become a symbol of manhood and male power. These anachronistic echoes form the background of Farhad Farzali's work, and his attachment to the figure of the tiger.

Farhad is particularly interested in the issue of the feline fur. His series of soft plush tigers is made from tiger-aspect clothing, worn nowadays by Azerbaijani women. Such motifs are considered traditional in popular culture in Azerbaijan, although they come from the international textile industry. If the symbol of the tiger is divided in a binary way between the genres, Farhad proposes a non-binary and transgressive interpretation: the contemporary feminine garment sculpts a plush whose iconography is that of the majestic and virilizing tiger. In addition, the feline plush is a common wedding gift in Azerbaijan. The artist therefore combines codes and references in order to question the value of this symbol and its charge.

In his recent series of paintings, the artist varies the facial expressions of his tiger heads, in a systematic spirit that links the tiger to its status of malleable and variable image. Between inspiration of Persian miniatures for their stylisation, and anthropomorphism cartoonesque, these painted tiger heads tend to reconcile the imaginations.
